SECOND WEEK OF TENNESSEE FFA LEADERSHIP CAMP HOSTS 13 HIGH SCHOOLS

DOYLE, TN – The second week of this year's seven-week Tennessee Future Farmers of America (FFA) Leadership Training Camp hosted over 200 FFA members, advisors, and guests from 13 chapters for a five-day training session. The annual event is held at Camp Clements in Van Buren County, the state's only FFA camp and the nation's oldest. Since 1927, Camp Clements has helped further FFA's mission through leadership development, team building, and communications training, all couched in agriculture.

High school FFA members participate in the week-long program, which is packed with activities and classes that teach agriculture, forestry, public speaking, parliamentary procedures, basic accounting, and more. These activities and classes aim to instill the core leadership values that guide the FFA organization. All attendees should find themselves better equipped to lead their chapters and communities back home.

This week, the Green Hill chapter of Wilson County was named the winner of the "Outstanding Officer Team" and "Outstanding Chapter."
