Chairman's Report

Thank you for supporting FFA in Tennessee. Your support for the Foundation helps secure the future of agricultural education and FFA programs for youth in our state. These programs in turn help secure the future of agriculture and, indeed, our way of life in the United States of America.

Securing the future of our way of life—this is a big vision. But training the next generation of agriculturists and Americans is critically important, and this is the purpose of the agricultural education and FFA program in America. As you review this report, keep in mind the thousands of young men and women across our state that you encourage and support through the Tennessee FFA Foundation. These individuals are well represented by the twelve Tennesseans featured on the cover of this 2011 Annual Report. Take another look. These twelve national finalists will compete at the 2011 National FFA Convention in Indianapolis for top honors in the nation. Ten national proficiency finalists and two Star finalists, these are the fruits of our labor.

These national finalists also showcase what the agricultural education and FFA program in Tennessee has to offer. They, like so many members of FFA, have experienced one of the most effective educational programs available in public education today. Through their involvement they have learned about America's food and fiber industry while also learning math, science, technology, communications, leadership and other soft skills. Teachers have prepared them in the classroom, in the laboratory, and that knowledge has been inculcated through the FFA's "learning by doing" education model with supervised agricultural experiences and participation in FFA career development events and leadership programs.

Today's FFA members are among the best prepared students in America. They are prepared to succeed in careers or in further education, and they are prepared for a lifetime of informed choices. They are the real winners in the race to the top.

In my 2010 message to you, I began by sharing that our Foundation had reached a milestone in achieving a long-established goal of building our endowment to the \$2 million level and thereby helping secure the Foundation's capacity to perpetually support our program in Tennessee. In 2011, that endowment grew to exceed \$3 million

due to your generosity and returns on our investments. However, as we take stock of the past year, we must acknowledge the loss to Tennessee FFA of one of its most important leaders and one of our heroes, Kenneth K. Mitchell.

One of my most poignant memories is that of attending the organizational meeting of the Tennessee FFA Foundation, Inc. board of directors in 1983. The undisputed leader of Tennessee FFA that day and for all of my life was Kenneth K. Mitchell, our former state advisor. For me and for so many others he embodied all that FFA is, and we looked to Mr. Mitchell for our vision. One of Mr. Mitchell's most profound "Thoughts for the Day" borrowed from the Bible was, "Without a vision the people will perish." Mr. Mitchell communicated the FFA vision throughout his life. In his passing, we celebrate the remarkable contribution he made to Tennessee and to FFA.

In 1983, I could scarcely imagine the opportunity and responsibility to one day lead the Foundation. But Kenneth Mitchell surely understood that the young people in that room would someday take up the torch and carry it forward. He devoted his life to preparing others to assume the mantle of leadership.

Today, the young men and women featured in this report no doubt include some of those who will lead Tennessee FFA in the future. And you as a supporter of the Foundation are helping to prepare them for that inspiring task.

Let us maintain the legacy with which we have been so richly blessed. Thank you again for supporting agricultural education and FFA in Tennessee.

Executive Director's Report

A partnership is a strategic alliance or relationship between two or more people or groups. Throughout the past few years and especially in these difficult economic times, I have been impressed by the numerous partnerships that the Tennessee FFA Foundation has developed over time, and how these partnerships impact our programs. Our partners serve as hosts to the annual Goodwill Tour, support our state and national FFA convention, exhibit at the career/ trade show and volunteer as judges for various events, instructors at Forestry Camp or as counselors at Camp Clements. In our awards and recognition programs, we have partners who sponsor proficiency awards programs, support career development events and contribute to the regional awards banquets. Many partners also serve as guest lecturers in the classroom, provide equipment to modernize greenhouses or laboratories and provide work opportunities for our FFA students. We have other partners who provide scholarships for high school graduates, which is a direct investment in the next generation of agriculturists, industry and political leaders in Tennessee.

Throughout the years, partnerships with individuals, companies, state agencies and other non-profits have played a critical role in the continued success of the Tennessee FFA Foundation. Without these partnerships, the Foundation would be in a different place today. Thank you for your partnership, cooperation and generosity of time, money and influence to support FFA.

The Foundation continues to be financially strong and viable. Highlights of the Foundation's growth for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2011 are:

- Total assets grew about 25% over the prior year due primarily to the government grant-in-aid and to gains in our investments (both realized and unrealized). The balance sheet showed total assets versus total liabilities and equities of \$3,219,213 compared to \$2,566,476 in the prior year.
- Overall Foundation revenues were just over \$1 million compared to \$920,000 in 2010. The operating statement showed net income of \$598,604 compared to \$471,738 for the prior year.
- The Foundation received another grant-in-aid of \$250,000 from Governor Phil Bredesen, Commissioner Ken Givens and the General Assembly. The 2011-2012 state budget has already been approved for the same amount under the new administration of Governor Bill Haslam, Commissioner Julius Johnson and the General Assembly. Special thanks to all who made this investment possible in the young men and women involved in 4-H and FFA in our state.

- Total contributions were about \$500,000 this fiscal year compared
 to \$650,000 last year. The difference due primarily to donations
 to the McWherter Monument Commission. Other contributions
 from individuals, associations, corporations and other foundations
 remained near the same level as the prior year. Donations to
 various college scholarships increased slightly. Rebate programs,
 special events and other revenue remained steady.
- The McWherter statue was dedicated on October 15, 2010. The remaining balance of \$9,645 was transferred to the Foundation for future repair and maintenance of the statue. See the enclosed insert for a final report on the McWherter Monument Commission.
- Total Foundation expenses were approximately \$411,234 or a
 decrease of about 8.2% from the prior year. The difference
 again related to the McWherter statue expenses. The Foundation
 was able to provide almost \$140,000 in scholarships, awards
 and recognition and another \$130,000 in support for programs,
 events and projects. Cost of operations amounted to about 30%
 of all expenses.

Sometimes there are better and smarter ways to grow than just in size. We can grow in reputation by building on the donor/vendor relationships established over many years. We can grow in advocacy for the agriculture industry and particularly for agricultural education. We can grow in customer service by expanding our efforts in support of FFA programs, activities, scholarships and awards and recognition. We can grow more profitable by remaining true to our mission, expand our donor base, minimize expenses and make prudent investment decisions. But no matter how large we grow or how many anniversaries we celebrate, our touchstone endures with these three words that define us as a non-profit organization: Relationships, Commitment and Accountability.

Our board of directors led by John Rose continues to provide outstanding leadership as they formulate policy, establish procedures, review the financial situation and evaluate the results. The Sponsoring Committee led by Lee Todd has assisted greatly in the growth of the Foundation as they continue to encourage our elected officials to support FFA and 4-H in Tennessee. Farm Bureau has helped significantly to make our case in the halls of government. In spite of the economy, all major donors maintained their sponsorships. Under the direction of the board, management strives to execute their policies and procedures, provide helpful information and manage the day-to-day operations. Administrative Assistant Shannon Turner has been a real asset in the successful performance of the Foundation and the Alumni since being hired in February, 2010. We sincerely appreciate the pro-bono office space, computer support, student assistance and other resources provided by the School of Agriculture at Tennessee Tech University.







