Basic Procedures and Oral History Interview Questions

for the Tennessee FFA Oral History Project Interviews

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* Prior to the interview you will need to have a recording device such as a blank tape and tape player or other electronic media recording device.

Begin your interview by stating the purpose of the oral history project on the recording. A sample statement might be:

This interview is part of the Tennessee FFA Oral History Project. This interview is being done by <u>(give name of person doing the interview)</u>. Today is <u>(give date)</u> and I am interviewing <u>(give name of interviewee)</u> at <u>(location where interview is taking place)</u>. This interview will be part of the Tennessee FFA Archives Collection and may be used for research purposes. Is that ok with you <u>(give name of interviewee)?</u>

- 2. Where did you go to school and what FFA chapter did you belong to?
- 3. Did you hold any office on the chapter, state, or national level? If so, what were they?
- 4. Did you ever win any FFA awards? If so, what were they?
- 5. Did you have any siblings or relatives involved in the FFA? What were their roles?
- 6. What types of agricultural related activities were you involved in?
- 7. What are some of your fondest memories of being an FFA member?
- 8. After being an FFA member, what type of career did you pursue?
- 9. What changes have you seen in the FFA over the years?
- 10. What would you like to see happen in the future for FFA?
